Before the actual transport:

Documents are always required:

- **INV** – invoice
- **PL** – packing list
- **(AW) B/L** – bill of lading

When transporting emergency goods (e.g. batteries, medicines and used goods) we may require:

- C/O – certificate of origin
- Export licences
- MSDS document – in the case of dangerous goods
- Military licences
- EUR1 – accompanying certificate
- AVI certificate - when transporting live animals

For the inquiry itself:

- Type of transport and/or time frame
- Delivery condition of carriage (Incoterms)
- From where - to where
- Description of goods (safe, unsafe)
- Number, weight, volume of cargo pieces
- Stackability
- Insurance - on request insurance in excess of the carrier's liability

Necessary documents for delivery and clearance:

- Power of attorney
- VAT certificate and EORI number
- Extract from the Commercial Register
- Commission contract

The VAT payer is exempt from the obligation to pay output tax, including export. Only on presentation of proof that the goods have been transported outside the EU. Customs duty is not levied when exporting goods from the Czech Republic.
